

- 2. Log-In with the same email and password as previous years
- 3. Go to Family Profile
- 4. Select "Enroll Now" in blue next to the name of the 4-Her you are enrolling
- 5. Update information
- 6. Select the club(s) you are enrolling in and then select next
- 7. Answer the questions
- 8. Sign consent and releases
- 9. Finally select the green "Submit"
- 10. You're re-enrolled!

For their first club meeting in September, the STEM Ambassadors elected new club officers.



The 4-Her's volunteered to help spread fresh woodchips on the trails at the Essex County Environmental Center. They also hiked the trail at South Mountain to Hemlock Falls. Animal Science at Memorial Day Summer Camp

Youth in 1st grade to 6th grade learned about different aspects of animal science this summer. They learned about how bird beaks have changed over time to adapt to different types of food. They also learned about the importance of pollinators like bees and butterflies. To finish out the summer, campers got the chance to meet puppies that are being raised to be guide dogs for the Seeing Eye. They learned about different types of working dogs like medical assistance dogs, police dogs, and guide dogs.











Everyone Can Create at the Clifton Library

Youth in kindergarten to 3rd grade used technology to spark their creativity. They explored their creative side using different devices, including iPads and Spheros, small spherical robots. They learned about different forms of expression through drawing, photography, video, and music. Youth created their own stop motions, songs, and animations. This program ran for six weeks from July to August at the Clifton Public Library. The STEM Ambassadors volunteered at this program to assist younger youth with the technology. This program was provided through the Apple Community Education Initiative.


