





Rutgers Cooperative Extension of Passaic County Summer Harvest Showcase

Project Entry Details:

- * All Passaic County Youth and Adults can enter projects for Divisions 140, 150, and 160 from kindergarten age to adulthood. Youth and adults will be judged separately.
- * There can be 3 entries per class for Divisions 150 & 160 (see list below) and there is no maximum for entries per Division.
- * Projects must be produced by the person entering.
- * 4-H JUDGING uses the Danish system in which each item is evaluated against a standard. Therefore, many exhibits will receive Excellent, Very Good, or Good ratings. If there are three or more entries, one exhibit in each Division or Class may receive a rosette. All Best in Class and Division projects will be awarded prizes.
- * Project Drop-off We will collect submissions for plant and food projects at the RCE Office in Wayne, NJ (1310 Route 23 N, Wayne, NJ 07470) on August 14th from 4-6 pm and at the RCE fair tent on August 15th from 6-7 pm.
- * Projects will be showcased at Passaic County Fair from August 15th to 18th at Garret Mountain Reservation (8 Mountain Ave. Woodland Park, NJ 07424)
- * Project Divisions include Foods & Nutrition (140), Vegetables, Fruits, and Herbs (150), and Outdoor / Indoor Gardening (160).

DIVISION 140 - FOOD & NUTRITION

Rules:

- -Exhibit must be made by person submitting entry
- Must provide display dish to show entries
- There may be only one entry to a class.
- -Prepared mixes may not be used/ All must be homemade.
- -A copy of the recipe printed should accompany each entry.
- -Exhibitors entering a cake or a pie may enter either the whole or $\frac{1}{2}$.

Classes for Division 140- Food and Nutrition

- Class 1: Quick breads (1 sample)
- Class 2: Cookies
- Class 3: Cakes (1 sample)
- Class 4: Pastry
- Class 5: Yeast bread (1 sample)
- Class 6: Pie (1 sample, whole or half)
- Class 7: Decorated cakes (1 sample, whole or half)
- Class 8: Decorated cookies
- Class 9: Decorated cupcakes
- Class 10: Other decorated items
- Class 11: Other baked items not listed
- Class 12: Preserved fruit or jam
- Class 13: Preserved pickles
- Class 14: Preserved vegetables
- Class 15: Other preserved items
- Class 16: Menu
- Class 17: Recipe file
- Class 18: Food made with items from your garden
- Class 19: 1 jar of salsa (>8oz)





DIVISION 150 - FRUITS, VEGETABLES & HERBS

Rules:

- Any adult or youth who has helped care for the plant is eligible to exhibit
- Individual can submit up to 3 entries per class
- All picture entries must be original and must be matted on paper along with the required text typed or written in a caption
- Projects may be presented in a vase, pot, or plated for display
- -Number of specimens required is noted next to class name

Classes for Division 150 - Fruits, Vegetables and Herbs

- 1. Beans, pole or bush 6 pods
- 2. Cucumbers 2
- 3. Eggplant 1
- 4. Lettuce- 1 head or 3 leaves.
- 5. Peppers –2, any variety
- 6. Tomatoes- 1 large or 3 grape sizes
- 7. Beets -1-2 with tops removed.
- 8. Broccoli -2 stalks
- 9. Cabbage, white or red -1 head
- 10. Carrot 2 1 including leaves.
- 11. Parsnips 2, all but 1"- 2" of tops removed.
- 12. Peppers -2, any variety
- 13. Potatoes, any variety 2
- 14. Watermelon 1
- 15. Squash, any variety 1
- 16. Squash blossoms, 1
- 17. Fresh herb bundle single variety.
- 18. Fresh herb bundle multiple variety.
- Sample of dried and crushed herbs (minimum 1 TBS)

- 20. Dried herb bundle
- 21. Herb sachet
- 22. One vegetable presenting unusual or freak growth.
- 23. Arrangement of vegetables in container-home grown
- 24. Fruit 2 specimens
- 25. Other vegetables, fruits, or herbs not listed above.
- 26. 1 Photo of any of the items listed in this division with a description of the Photo type and location grown.
- 27. 1 Photo of you eating your favorite fruit or vegetable including in the caption some health facts about that food.
- 28. Arrangement of vegetables in container

Judging based on quality of specimens and condition of specimens, and presentation.





DIVISION 160 – OUTDOOR / INDOOR GARDENING

Rules:

- Any adult or youth who has helped care for the plant is eligible to exhibit
- Individual may submit up to 3 entries per class
- All picture entries must be original and must be matted on paper along with the required text typed or written in a caption
- -For cut flowers, limit 4 different varieties per class, 3 blooms per entry except for large flowers over 4 inches 1 bloom.

Classes for Division 160 – Outdoor / Indoor Gardening

- 1. Cut Flowers Annuals
- ★ Ageratum 2 sprays
- ★ Annual phlox 2 blooms
- ★ Calendula –2 blooms
- ★ Cosmos 2 blooms
- ★ Coxcomb 2 spikes
- ★ Marigolds, large type 2 blooms
- ★ Marigolds, dwarf varieties –2 blooms
- ★ Petunias, any type, mixed colors –2 blooms
- ★ Snapdragons –2 spikes
- ★ Verbenas 2 blooms
- ★ Zinnias, large flowering, mixed colors –2 blooms
- ★ Zinnias, pompons, mixed colors –2 blooms
- 2. Cut Flowers Biennials
- 3. Cut Flowers Perennials
 - ★ Perennial phlox –2 blooms
