A.C.A.S. (ADVANCING CAREERS IN AGRICULTURE & STEM)

This summer, nine teens from Passaic, Essex, Bergen, and Hudson Counties participated in the inaugural NJ Advancing Careers in Agriculture and STEM (ACAS) Internship Program. Over the course of the week, interns built leadership, career readiness, and workforce development skills. From organizing schedules and balancing budgets to writing resumes and practicing interview skills, they gained practical tools to prepare for the challenges of tomorrow.




The group traveled across New Jersey to explore the many opportunities within agriculture and STEM. Highlights included learning about hydroponics at Passaic County Community College and planting their own seeds, touring an urban garden that supports local families, harvesting mushrooms at an urban vertical farm, exploring Rutgers—New Brunswick and its campus farm, and visiting a local poultry farm to learn about egg production right in Passaic County. Each stop opened new windows into career pathways while fostering teamwork, confidence, and curiosity.

Garden Lessons in Little Falls

The Seedling Squad at the Little Falls Public Library joined Passaic County 4-H to learn about composting and soil. They learned about the anatomy of the worm and the important function that worms and other decomposers place in our food system. During the second lesson, members of the Seedling Squad learned about the different components of soil and the importance of matching soil to the right plants.

Messy Crafts at the Library

Thanks to the Little Falls and Wayne Public Libraries for getting messy with Passaic County 4-H! Messy Crafts is a creative exploration of STEM, where youth are encouraged to make a mess in order to learn. Different projects include Creative Circuits, Magnetic Art, and Colorful Creations.







Beneficial Bugs

Youth ages 7-11 met once a week at the Clifton Public Library in May and June to learn all about bugs! They learned about insect identification, different ways to classify bugs, and the many beneficial things bugs do for us. Youth were able to meet some critters as well! They met butterflies, worms, & ladybugs.







Animal Science in Paterson

Youth at Memorial Day Summer Camp in Paterson learned all about animal science this summer. They were given the chance to meet and learn about a lot of different types of animals like bunnies, snakes, lizards and chickens.

Horsemanship 101

This spring, Passaic County 4-H introduced Horsemanship 101, a Short-Term Experience Program (STEP) designed for youth in grades 4 through 8 with a passion for horses. Over the course of 12 weeks, club members met weekly at the North Jersey Equestrian Center to dive into a wide range of equine topics including grooming, nutrition, health, breeds and colors, and careers in the animal science field.

Through hands-on activities, participants learned how to care for horses, work safely in the barn, interpret horse body language, and understand basic horse behavior. They also explored first aid and veterinary science, gaining valuable insight into equine health and wellness.

This program would not have been possible without the generous support of the North Jersey Equestrian Center and the Bauer family, whose partnership helped make this unique learning experience a reality.
